TEACHER INFORMATION

The *tense* of a verb is used to show the time at which the action of that verb takes place.

Most verbs are regular and follow the same pattern for the past, present and future tense. For example, with the verb to jump: /jump//am jumping (present tense); /jumped//was jumping (past tense); /will jump (future tense).

Irregular verbs are those that do not follow this pattern, particularly in the past tense. For example: / rise (rose), / teach (taught), / mean (meant), / win (won), / do (did), / begin (began).

An *auxiliary verb* helps to form the tense of a verb. The verbs *to be, to have* and *to do* are auxiliary verbs; e.g. / have eaten. The auxiliary verb used in the future tense is will; e.g. / will eat.
